Approximately 50,000 Americans a year die in automotive and alcohol related crashes.

An estimated 24 young Americans a day die in alcohol related traffic crashes.

One person every 32 minutes dies in America in a drunk driving accident.

Drunk driving is the nation's most frequently committed violent crime.

Half of all teenage automotive fatalities are alcohol-related.

Each year, more than half of the fatal accidents are related to alcohol.

About 2 in 5 Americans will be involved in an alcohol-related crash at sometime in their life.

The typical American child will be exposed to 160,000 – 180,000 beer ads before reaching the legal drinking age.

70% of adolescents ages 13-14 have consumed alcohol by the 8th grade.

The average age when children start experimenting with drinking is 11-12.






# CHECOLOT


# STUENT ART


These contests will allow every student from the school to design a drunk driving prevention poster and submit it for national distribution and scholarship money.

### Kelli Laine Lewis The Carolinas Rockers For Life

July 18, 1982 - January 21, 2001

### Kristian Nicole Wesnesky Pittsburgh Rockers For Life

March 2, 1986 - March 21, 2004

On March 21, 2004, all Kristian Wesnesky wanted to do was go home. Instead, a drunk driver took her life. Unjustly, his prison sentence is over and he is home with his family. Kristian, however, never went home to her loved ones. A sweet, outgoing, beautiful friend and family member, Kristian's life should not have ended so soon. ### Santa Fe Rockers For Life

October 22, 1979 - January 2, 1997

Eric Santiago, 17, had dreams of playing college football. But that dream was cut short when an underage drunk driver ran a stop sign and crashed into Eric's car. The car spun several times and Eric was ejected. He later died of head injuries at a local hospital. Eric left behind a younger brother who was following in his footsteps. "Eric was his hero," said Santiago's mother. Ve all need to remember that even though it has been 10 years since Eric has passed, the pain has not gone away.



### Kayla Qynn Miller

### **Buffalo Rockers For Life**

February 17, 1990 - January 21, 2007

When Kayla Miller got a digital camera for her 13th birthday, her mother said it was the start of something she'd become known for, taking photos of herself. But the aspiring actress didn't just take pictures of herself; she also liked having snapshots of her friends. She liked to save memories. And now, memories are all Kayla's family and friends have of her. "She was the type of kid that brightened everyone's world," said Kayla's mother.

Kayla, 16, was killed when the car she was a front-seat passenger in crashed into two trees off the side of the road. She was pronounced dead at the scene.

### Virginia Rockers For Life

April 8, 1961 - September 1, 1978

"When my brother Ricky Osborne was 17 years old, he was riding his bike one day from a friend's house and a drunk driver ran off the road and hit him. He suffered from massive head trauma and was in a coma for a little over three weeks. My mother was at he hospital every day by his side until the realization of the fact that he wasn't going to make it set in with her. She finally had him removed from life support September 1, 1978. The man who had killed him, from what I know, only served 1 year in prison for involuntary manslaughter. My brother had just finished job corps and was heading on to a great career as an auto mechanic. I was young when this happened, but I wanted to give my older brothers something to remember him by. They knew him well and I was only 1 ½ years old but still...if it wasn't for someone drinking and driving, I would have one more older brother today. Thanks, Illumina Records, for letting me share my story with you and for you dedicating this compilation cd to my big brother! Say NO to DRINKING AND DRIVING!"



### Hishley Ann Perry January 15, 1984 - January 27, 2002

NYC Rockers For Lofe Vol. III

It was just 12 days after Ashley Ann Perry's 18th birthday, when a drunk driver killed her. Ashley just left a friends house and had only traveled 400ft when a 19-year-old drunk diver, driving on a suspended license, came around the curve to fast. The car veered into Ashley's lane and hit her vehicle head on. Ashley was the front seat passenger and was wearing her seatbelt, but she died at the scene. Meanwhile, in the other car one of the boys switched places with the drunk driver and told the investigating officer that he was driving the car, and that Ashley's car was on the wrong side of the road, and that her car caused the accident. The driver of Ashley's car fled the scene and didn't call for help until 30 minutes later. The driver of the car has still not been identified. Ashley would have survived the crash if the driver of her car had called for help right away. Ashley's family is asking you to please, don't trust your friends to get you home safely if there is a chance that they have been drinking. Call an adult, parent, aunt, sibling, whomever who can think of so that you can get home safely.

Heidi Patrice Hanover & Sadie Qeann Clark

November 13, 1898 - August 14, 2006 June 24, 1990 - August 14, 2006

### The Midwest Rockers For Life

Heidi Patrice Hanover, 16, and Sadie Leann Clark, 15, were killed when their car was struck by a drunk driver; the girls were pronounced dead at the scene of the accident. "They were no relation by "blood" but were raised as cousins," Hanover's mother said. June 14, 1978 - March 8, 2003

Dancing, singing, trips to the beach, the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, and great times with friends and family (especially her son)—Jillian Ann Martin loved it all. Unfortunately, everything she loved was taken from her the night her intoxicated boyfriend's motorcycle crashed into a concrete wall. Everyone makes mistakes, but unlike most, this one can't be corrected. Her son and her loving family and friends must grow up and learn to live without her all because of one mistake. A great night has the potential to end miserably if the right choices aren't made. Always remember to make the right choice: don't drink and drive, and make sure nobody else does, either.

### Northern New England Rockers For Life Katelun Di Sessa Boston Rockers For Life Vol 2

December 6, 1984 - April 22, 2006

Take a minute to think about your best friend. Think about how funny she is and how often she makes you smile. Think about how she drops anything to help you out and listens to you for hours. Think about all the memories, all the jokes, all the fun you've had. Now think about losing her forever. That's what happened to the friends and family of Katelyn DiSessa. On her way home on April 22, 2006, Katelyn's life, along with that of her unborn child, was taken by an alleged drunk driver. Now Katelyn's friends and family are left only with memories. Before you drink and drive, think about Katelyn's story. Remember: everyone else on the road has a best friend, too.
